Wythe Hotel, New York, USA

A former barrel and cask cooperage dating from 1901, this industrial building on the Brooklyn waterfront has now been converted into a 72-room hotel by trio Australian hotelier Peter Lawrence, local property developer Jed Valentas (of Two Trees) and celebrated restaurateur Andrew Tarlow (of Diner and Marlow & Sons). The original exposed bricks, arched windows and cast iron columns have all been preserved, while the reclaimed pine ceilings were used to make the beds. The hotel's rooftop bar is located in a new glass box extension that sits on top of the old warehouse, while the restaurant, Reynards, serve seasonal fare and wood-fired dishes created by Tarlow.



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
