Finally, a Brooklyn hotel that even staunch Manhattanites will want to wander to: Williamsburg's **Wythe Hotel**, a 72-room refurbished textile factory. Tastemakers not only are rolling in for the market-driven menu offered by restaurateur Andrew Tarlow and chef Sean Rembold (of nearby Marlow & Sons) at Reynards, the hotel's restaurant, but, starting this month, they'll be headed to the basement for a 60-seat screening room and adjacent private bar. Upstairs, there's the Ides, a massive rooftop watering hole with stunning views of, well, the glistening Manhattan skyline. *From \$175 per night; wythehotel.com.*—JULIE VADNAL
